

III. THE AUTHOR INDEX

In this INDEX, the author is listed alphabetically, followed by the title of his article and the issue number in which it appears. Nearly all the articles which have a title have been listed, either with an author (when known) or as anonymous (Anon). Exceptions to this are in the case of some biographies, book reviews and obituaries. These authors are, however, listed under those subject headings.

The lower-case letter code described for the SUBJECT INDEX also pertains to the AUTHOR INDEX. In addition, (r) refers to a reprint and (t) refers to a translation. Many of the articles are reprints from other philatelic publications, sometimes Polish. Quite often the author's manuscript was written in Polish and required translation.

As mentioned earlier, this index may be more useful than the SUBJECT INDEX, since it is probably easier to remember an author's name or surmise the gist of an article from its title.

When an author is listed several times, the article titles appear in chronological sequence.
